Request for Emergency Equipment Test

The issuance of this AIC is necessary to inform all aviation stakeholders of the planned testing of emergency equipment. This test is essential to verify the operational readiness, reliability, and efficiency of critical safety equipment in accordance with the Belize Civil Aviation Regulations (BCARs).

This AIC ensures that pilots, operators, air traffic services, emergency response agencies, and other affected parties receive timely and accurate information regarding the nature, schedule, and possible operational impacts of the test activities. This information supports situational awareness, reduces the potential for misinterpretation of emergency signals, and contributes to the overall safety and continuity of aerodrome operations while testing is in progress.

In accordance with the policies and procedures established by the Department of Civil Aviation and the National Search and Rescue Plan of Belize, all operators are hereby advised of the requirements governing the testing of emergency locator equipment, including Emergency Locator Transmitters (ELT), Emergency Position-Indicating Radio Beacons (EPIRB), and Personal Locator Beacons (PLB).

No operator shall conduct such tests without prior coordination and approval from the Department of Civil Aviation.
